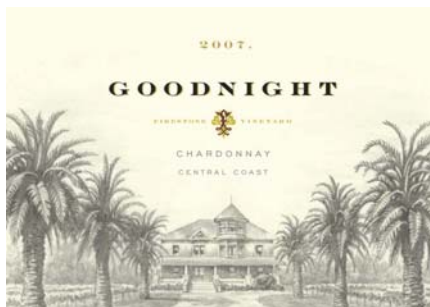


PINOT GRIGIO

CALIFORNIA

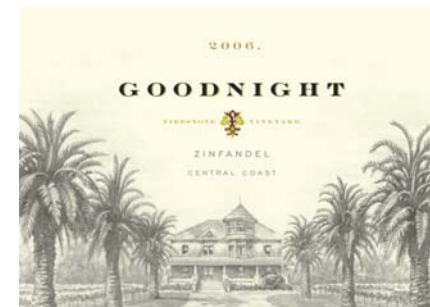
Crafted from grapes sourced from the Firestone Estate vineyards in Santa Ynez Valley and several coastal sites in Monterey County, the Pinot Grigio is crisp and charmingly fruit-forward. There are enchanting notes of anise and fresh lime on the nose of this inviting white wine. On the mouth, it is abundant with flavors of Bartlett pear, Meyer lemons and white flowers. Serve moderately chilled to highlight the fragrant floral and citrus notes.



CHARDONNAY

CENTRAL COAST

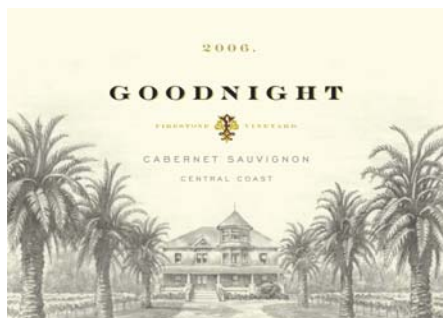
Our Goodnight Chardonnay combines the best of Old and New World-style Chardonnays. Its attractive, yet moderate acidity allows for a crisp sensibility, while istropical fruit notes suggest a New World approach. On the nose, there are ample aromas of pineapples, ripe white peaches and orange blossom honey. On the mouth, pineapple notes are balanced nicely by flavors of toasted almonds, vanillin and green apples.



ZINFANDEL

CENTRAL COAST

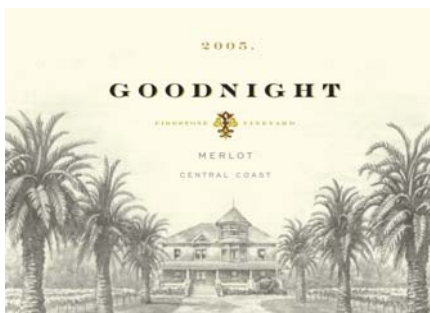
Our Zinfandel offers up classic Zin notes of cracked white and black pepper, caramel, pomegranate, and summer raspberries. On the mouth, this wine is not shy on fruit, with jammy notes of backyard plums, boysenberries and blackberries. Because of its inherently soft tannins, this wine is drinkable in its youth, and pairs exceedingly well with pizza, cheese burgers just off the grill



CABERNET SAUVIGNON

The Goodnight Cabernet Sauvignon was produced with the intention of dispelling some of the pretense that surrounds this noble red varietal. Our interpretation of Cabernet Sauvignon is decidedly approachable, fruit-forward and lush. There are juicy, enticing aromas of cassis, licorice, mocha and cola on the nose. On the mouth, this wine delivers with bold flavors of dark, rich chocolate, cassis, plum and ripe cherry.



MERLOT

CENTRAL COAST

Possessing a lovely mouth feel, our Goodnight Cellars Merlot is an elegant, classic expression of this varietal. Aromatically, there are very attractive notes of juniper berry, eucalyptus, espresso and mocha on the nose. On the mouth, the fine-grain tannins coat the palate pleasantly and unobtrusively, leaving in their wake a long finish of dark, ripe Bing cherries and dark chocolate.



MERITAGE

CENTRAL COAST

This Meritage is the perfect showcase for the depth, versatility and finesse of Santa Ynez Valley Merlot, which makes up almost half of the blend. The nose is complex, with notes of cherry and mocha with undertones of juniper berry and cigar from the Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. On the palate, the Meritage shines with flavors of cherry, dark chocolate, plums and baking spice. The tannins are coating, yet soft enough for sipping alone.

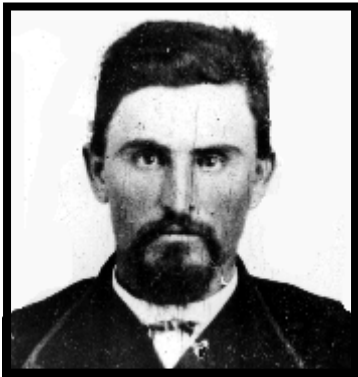

THE STORY OF CHARLES GOODNIGHT



Charles Goodnight
(1836-1929)

Born in 1836, Charles Goodnight served as a Confederate Soldier during the American Civil War. After the war, he joined a statewide effort to round up cattle which had wandered off during the four war-torn years. It was this experience that led him to become one of the most famous ranchers and cowboys in Texas history. He owned over over one hundred thousand head of Longhorn cattle during the 1870s. His herd size, experience as a Texas Ranger and luck with money made him one of the founding fathers of the Texas panhandle.

Many stories about Charles credit him with the invention of the chuckwagon—the pantry and kitchen on wheels—which joined his cattle drives north to Wyoming. In addition to mobilizing old-style BBQ, he raised a herd of American Bison near his home in the Palo Duro Canyon. One of his proudest accomplishments was cross-breeding domestic cattle and buffalo, producing a new breed he named “cattalo.”

The Goodnight Cellars brand was created by vintner Bill Foley, the greatgrandson of Charles Goodnight, in honor of his ancestors and as a tribute to American pioneers and adventurers. The diligence, hard work and love of discovery represents Bill’s personal business philosophy.
